### Triple Negative Breast Cancer

March 3rd is recognized as Triple Negative Breast Cancer (TNBC) Day, a date dedicated to raising awareness about TNBC and highlighting the need for increased research, funding, and support for those affected by this aggressive form of breast cancer.

Triple-negative breast cancer accounts for about 10–15% of all breast cancers. These cancers tend to be more common in women younger than age 40, who are Black, or who have a BRCA1 mutation. Triple-negative breast cancer can have the same signs and symptoms as other common types of breast cancer.
